CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF NORTHEASTERN MANITOULIN AND THE ISLANDS

BY-LAW NO. 2025-13 Being a By-law to Amend Zoning By-law No. 2002-32

Being a By-law for the purpose of amending Zoning By-law No. 2018-41, being a By-law, to regulate the Use of Land of the Corporation of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, under the Authority of Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P. 13, as amended;

Whereas, the Corporation of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, has ensured that adequate information has been made available to the public and has held at least one (1) public meeting after due notice for the purpose of informing the public of this by-law;


And Whereas, Council deems it appropriate to concur and, whereby Restricted Area Zoning By-law 2018-41 is to be amended to permit by Special Provision, Section 7.1.40 i) Commercial one day private events including accessory uses.

And Whereas, upon considering representations in respect to the zoning proposal and the report of the Clerk of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, the Council of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, deems it advisable to amend Zoning By-law No. 2018-41, as amended:

Now Therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, enacts, as follows:

- 1) Section 7, Specific Zones, Shoreline Residential Zone 7.1.4.40 SR-40 is hereby amended to permit:
 - i) commercial one day wedding and special occasion events
 - ii) one portable storage container (Sea bin)
 - iii) one 10 x10 accessory building to be utilised as a washroom (Vault privy)
 - iv) vendors, catering and/or beer gardens to support the event,
 - v) camping is not to be permitted.
 - iii) Subsection 1) applies to that parcel of land described as Island JD 1467, Location AE 212, PCL 621, Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, District of Manitoulin, registered in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of Manitoulin (31).
- 4) All other uses, performance standards and provisions of Restricted Zoning By-law 2018-41, which apply to the Shoreline Residential (SR) Zone not specifically varied hereby continue to apply to the land described under Subsection (1.) of this By-law.
- 5) That it is hereby certified that this amending By-law is in conformity with the Official Plan for the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands.
- 6) Schedule "A" hereto attached shall be considered to be part of this By-law.
- 8) This by-law shall come into force in accordance with the provisions of Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter P. 13 and take effect on the date of its final reading subject to the expiration of the 20 day appeal period, provided in Section 34(19) of the Planning Act and subject to the approval of the Land Planning Appeal Tribunal where objections to this by-law are filed with the Municipal Clerk together with the prescribed fee.



Dear Councilors:

I write in regard to the Rezoning request for Louis Island before you on May 8th. I kindly ask that you DECLINE the rezoning request.

I am a fourth generation owner of Island TP 2842, PCL 471 and PCL 472 in the Bay of Islands. I also manage this property for the extended family through a U.S. Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) composed of the great grandchildren of the original owners, Henry Nicholas Muller and his wife Mary.

Our extended family spends roughly four months each season in the Bay of Islands, canoeing, fishing, hiking, bird watching, swimming, picking blueberries, and enjoying the natural beauty and restorative properties of the Bay and its environs. This year we will arrive on May 28th to open the island and launch boats, and we will close the island in late September. The LLC has an annual budget of \$30,000 USD to open, run and close the property.

This \$30,000 is spent annually on boat service, storage and maintenance at HarborVue Marina; dock rental, gas and oil, and island caretaker fees at Forbes Holiday Resort in Whitefish Falls; taxes to NEMI, landfill fees at Dodge Haulage in Espanola, insurance with

I think the NEMI area is fortunate to have someone such as Chris operating such a vessel with such a purpose.

I would like to thank anyone reading this that serves on local government bodies that are charged, in part, with the care of our natural resources. Thank you for your service.

In addition to these fixed annual costs, during our use of the island property we buy groceries, gas, fishing licenses, fishing bait, tackle, beer and wine, water filters, boating supplies, meals in restaurants, sunscreen, dog food, and so on.

As a family, we have returned each season since 1928, and continue to invest in the buildings and boats, to enjoy the unique natural surroundings of the Bay of Islands, as do all of the island owners in the Bay.

The Rezoning request before you would create a concerning precedent, if approved, by rezoning from residential to commercial an uninhabited island. If allowed, how could additional similar requests be prevented? Our property is surrounded by a dozen uninhabited islands, any of which would make a splendid wedding/event location. But in doing so our ten acres would be made undesirable through increased noise, boat traffic, light pollution, water pollution, etc.

Like us, many Bay of Island owners and visitors would be discouraged from visiting if islands are commercially developed. A pristine environment is the foundation for the long-term sustainability of NEMI's environment and economy, and its uniqueness. In a world cluttered with wedding venues, is another needed? Here? As an aside, doesn't the Island Lodge at Ireson Island in the Bay already function as a wedding and event location? There was certainly a wedding event there June 22, 2024.

We believe that economic development in NEMI should not come at the expense of the natural environment, and research and studies continue to prove that strong natural environmental protections and safeguards are better for economic development than disregarding such protections for development projects. A healthy environment is the key to a healthy economy.

Therefore, I kindly ask that you DECLINE the Rezoning Request for Louisa Island.

Dear Mayor MacNevin and Members of Council,

I am writing to express my strong support for the proposed site-specific zoning amendment for a portion of Louisa Island, as submitted by Mr. Chris Blodgett of North Channel Cruise Line.

As a resident of Little Current with a waterfront property approximately 10 kilometres south of Louisa Island, I can say with confidence that this area is one of the most beautiful in Ontario. On a clear day, my family and I can see the island from our home. Despite being a "close" neighbour, I have no objection to Mr. Blodgett's proposal. In fact, I fully support it. The thoughtful development of a daytime event venue on this privately owned parcel strikes me as a responsible, low-impact way to enhance access to the North Channel while protecting its ecological and recreational value.

Mr. Blodgett has long been a trusted and respected figure in the boating and tourism industry. Through North Channel Cruise Line and Canadian Yacht Charters, he and his family have opened the region to thousands of visitors in an inclusive and environmentally conscious manner. Their contribution to the local economy is undeniable—both in direct business and through the tourism ripple effect across our community.

This proposal reflects the same values: sustainable development, environmental stewardship, and community-minded entrepreneurship. The planned use of a vault privy, reliance on onboard sanitation systems, and commitment to leaving no waste behind align with provincial best practices for wilderness areas. In fact, his outlined approach mirrors

standards used in Killarney and Point Grondine Provincial Parks, both of which host far more foot traffic than what is proposed for Louisa Island.

While some opposition letters raise concerns over the loss of informal access to the beach, I believe it's important to respect the fact that this land has always been private. Mr. Blodgett is not excluding the public; rather, he is introducing a framework for responsible, occasional use that shares the island's beauty with a wider audience. The proposed use is modest—certainly more so than former commercial ventures like Island Lodge—and it respects both the land and its legacy.

As someone who values environmental conservation and local economic development, I believe this proposal is a model for how we can balance the two. I urge council to approve the zoning amendment at the May 8 meeting and support this thoughtful initiative that benefits both the community and the region.


Thank you for the intentional schedule and conversations you have led regarding the request to rezone Louisa Island. It is much appreciated.

I am writing this letter on behalf of Pride Manitoulin's 2025 committee to once again request support from the Municipality of NEMI. Since Pride Manitoulin's inception, we have been grateful to be supported by NEMI who has generously provided donations as well as accommodated several gestures of support, such as hosting our successful parade, flag raising, color run, and rainbow cross walks. Subject: Glyphosate - Unwilling Hosts - NEMI

I appreciate that this request was made to the Manitoulin Municipal Association recently. I am following up at my municipal level with the belief that local concerns may be different to those of the MMA. Please consider this request at the earliest possible council meeting.

To Mayor MacNevin and the Council of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, thank you for this opportunity to present information regarding the application of glyphosate in our municipality.

Glyphosate is a chemical that has been linked to many health concerns for humans and for other life in the natural environment. There have been numerous recent lawsuits in which people have been awarded extraordinary cash settlements for injuries tied to their exposure to glyphosate.

Glyphosate is currently being applied by the Ministry of Transportation Ontario (MTO), Hydro One, and their contractors on NEMI roadways, rights-of-way, and stations.

Gathering information from MTO and their contractors for glyphosate application is a laborious endeavor. Often the information is incomplete, inaccurate, difficult to understand, and often not provided at all. MTO often fails to properly notify the public when and where spraying has occurred, placing the public at risk. MTO has applied glyphosate in conditions that are not indicated, such as over water, before rain, during wind events, and at temperatures that are too hot or too cold.

Glyphosate application is funded by tax and rate payers. We should have a say in how our money is spent, especially when our health and the natural environment is being affected. We are already facing numerous health care crises in our community. There is also the possibility of municipalities being named in civil liability cases for those who might become ill due to glyphosate application in the community.

There have been a number of stories locally detailing the loss of bees, including one from a Tehkummah resident who tested her dead bees at the University of Guelph, finding glyphosate levels twice that which is considered "safe" for human consumption.

Also, on September 10, Temagami First Nation experienced a glyphosate spill. 600 litres of the concentrated herbicide was released from an overturned truck. As a result, a substantial cleanup effort has been undertaken. TFN has advised against harvesting plants and animals in a zone measuring 12km in diameter from the spill site.

Other measures can be taken to deal with foliage rather than the dispersal of chemicals. Manual maintenance, natural products, or livestock could be utilized.

I am proposing that NEMI pass a motion asking that NEMI be considered an unwilling host for the application of glyphosate products on all roadsides, municipal rights-of-way, and utility stations by the MTO and Hydro One and their contractors.
